

NAOMI Sewing Classes October 2017



1. Beginner Level A

This class addresses students which have no, or only little experience in using a household sewing machine. Students will learn how to set up, control and use a sewing machine in a professional way (parts, programs, settings). Students will be trained on holding the sewing line, cutting and sewing simple items like pillows, aprons or cloth using a patron.

2. Beginner Level B

The secondary level bases on the successful accomplishment of the 'Beginner Level A' class. Students will be trained on how to prepare patrons from the magazine Burda, samples and pictures. Following students will be trained on how to cut the material based on their patron. Furthermore students will learn how to make trousers, skirts, blouses and dresses.

3. Sewing technics

In the course 'special sewing technics' students learn more advanced technics of sewing, which will enable participants to increase their level of professionalism on the machine as well as by hand sewing. The following topics are the learning objectives during the class:

- To sew zippers in
- Buttonholes
- Different pocket mouth technics
- Collars
- Purging the edges
- Gathering
- Folding technics
- Tuck
- Button borders
- Wristbands

Who successfully completed the first 3 levels is eligible for the following classes.

4. Design & Development

The concept of the course 'Design & Development' is to create an atmosphere in which advanced students can feel encouraged to work on develop new products and create their paper patterns, which can be in the future added to the collection of Naomi. First ideas could be discussed and patterns can be proposed:

- Heads
- Shopping bags
- Cell-phone bags
- Skirts
- Sweatpants
- Laptop bags
- Dresses
- Slippers
- Etc.

5. Re-Design & Aesthetics

We are very happy to announce the creation of a re-use-it class. Students of this class have already a basic knowledge of sewing and participate in this class to fix and/or change used cloth. Students can develop individual ideas and can decide according to the used piece of cloth how to change or improve it and so decide how it can be transformed.

According to this, students are asked to routinize the following skills:

- Cutting
- Shortening
- Narrowing down
- To add ruffles or lacey
- Gathering of cloth
- To sew in or add new material

6. Production

The production class aims to prepare students to work in an industrial environment. Students will be trained on fast sewing industrial machines as well as on the overlock machine. The production class is successfully accomplished when an item of the expected quality is produced in a certain time frame. Successful students can be forwarded into the labor market.
